The McHenry County PEARLS Program is expanding. Led by the Harvard Community Senior Center, any county resident over age 60 can participate.



PEARLS Program to Encourage Active Rewarding Lives PEARLS is a new treatment program that delivers care and provides resources to community based clients with depression

PEARLS serves individuals over age 60 who suffer from depression. This program provided Free of Charge by the Harvard Community Senior Center - is funded by the McHenry County Health Board, McHenry County Senior Service Commission and McHenry County Community Development Block Grant. Any can refer an Older Adult to the PEARLS program. If you are concerned that someone you know may be depressed, call: 815 701 6605 and a trained social worker will respond.

A message about Medicare- Did you know? Medicare gives you access to a variety of preventive tests and screenings, most at no cost to you. For example, Medicare covers screenings for diabetes, osteoporosis, heart disease, and more.

If you have Original Medicare (Part A and Part B), sign in to your MyMedicare.gov account to see your personalized calendar of current and upcoming preventive services. Don't have an account yet? Sign up for free at MyMedicare.gov.

If you're in a Medicare Advantage (MA) Plan, contact your plan for a list of covered preventive services. MA Plans must cover all the same preventive services as Original Medicare, and some may offer additional services.

Preventive care can prevent you from getting sick and problems early detect health when treatment works best. Take advantage of these services as a proactive step toward maintaining a healthy lifestyle.


